From the Pastor's Desk.

THE STORY CONTINUES (Adapted from the sermon for 12-3-2023)

"Therefore, keep awake—for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. And what I say to you I say to all: Keep awake."

-Mark 13:35-37



Usually, a new year invites us to put the past year behind us, turn the page, or start a new chapter. This year, however, I invite you to consider how the story—your story that has been written over centuries and generations—continues.

The first season of the church year, Advent, actually begins in late November or early December, four weeks before Christmas Day. It is a time of looking ahead to the arrival of Christ, both at Christmas and at the fullness of time. We look ahead for what is to come, and we get ready. As I was thinking about this, it struck me as somewhat similar to the attention given to how we're expected to act or feel during this time of year—being good to ensure we're on the "nice list" for example.

We think about these things a lot in December, but are we really as concerned in July or August?

Many holiday movies end with a resolve to make the spirit of the season last all year—generosity, kindness, goodwill, love, and care. But then January arrives, then February, and so on, and we rarely see a "part two" set in the middle of summer or in the late fall with that same cast and holiday spirit.

If no one in the house knows when the master will return—in the evening, midnight, early morning, or dawn—then why not bring back the spirit of Advent throughout the year?

Maybe we will.

Maybe we do already, and we just need to point it out so that we turn our attention there. One commentary I read for this passage noted the difference between getting ready and staying ready. It's there in the parable. Keep awake; stay ready.

How do we keep that practice throughout the year? What are those things we can do each day, or each week, to keep ourselves spiritually awake?

How do we stay ready?

May we all take some time with that question in this new year. May we hold on to the answers and ideas we find, too, so we can revisit them again as the story continues.





Tellers do not need to be just from the second service, tellers can come from the first service as well.

MythBusters

WORSHIP ASSISTANT EDITION AND THE SERVICE OF THE S

#1 You have to have been a member of LCOR for several years before you can assist at worship.

Busted The only requirement necessary to assist at worship is your desire to do so. Many of our current worship assistants are not officially members

#2 Assisting at worship requires a large amount of time.

Some roles need an early arrival of 15 mins. before and/or after (e.g., altar guild requires about 15" before and/or after worship and ushering or greeting requires that you get to worship about 15" early as well.) Some roles are done completely within the worship service (e.g., Eucharistic minister or reader.)

#3 Being a worship assistant requires extensive training

Brief training (15 minutes or so) is provided for things like being a Eucharistic minister.

Shadowing an experienced assistant is how other roles are taught (such as ushering or altar guild.)

#4 There are age and gender requirements for assisting at worship.

The only requirement for Acolytes and Ushers is for them to be old enough to carry something safely. Operating the projector requires an ability to read, push a button and pay close attention during the service. Everyone can fill every role.

#5 LCOR has more than enough worship assistants.

The goal is for folks to be scheduled once a month or less. You are encouraged to share what Sundays you are not available; however, last-minute changes are made by trading with someone else. Folks are very flexible and helpful in this regard. Additional worship assistants are needed for all the worship roles including altar guild, Eucharistic minister, reader, usher, acolyte, greeter, projectionist (8:30 service only), and teller.

#6 If I inquire about being a worship assistant, I'll get roped into doing it for the rest of my life.

Questions are encouraged and there'll be no strong-arming or minimum requirement.

Some folks are only available every other month, some are unavailable in the summer, and some have only specific dates each month they can commit.

Altar Flowers

If you'd like to put flowers on the altar, simply sign up on the large flower chart on the bulletin board in the hallway leading to the education wing.

They may be given in honor of someone, in memory of someone, an event (anniversary birthday etc.), or simply to the glory of God! If the flowers are being given in honor or memory of someone, please write that on the flower chart. If no reason is stated on the chart then flowers will be given to the "Glory of God."

You must sign up a minimum of 7 days in advance. Flower arrangements are \$35 each. Please place your payment in the offering plate and be sure you designate the payment as "altar flowers." These flowers belong to you, after the flowers adorn the altar area for both services, please take your flowers home.
