From the Pastor's Desk

Where is your heart today? (Adapted from the sermon for Ash Wednesday)

This year, Ash Wednesday happened to fall on February 14—Valentine's Day. That might seem strange, and it could cause us to read the texts for today a little differently. We might notice just how many times the heart is mentioned.



¹²Yet even now, says the LORD, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; ¹³rend your hearts and not your clothing.

Joel 2:2-13

¹⁰Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. Psalm 51:10

²¹For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Matthew 6:21

On Ash Wednesday, we are reminded of God's love, but we also hear that call to reflect on what we are putting our hearts into. That whole passage from the Gospel of Matthew invites us to dig deep and understand ourselves. It's a challenge to reflect on what we value and emphasize the most in our lives—where our hearts are—and how our actions show that.

The message is there over and over again: "Beware of practicing your piety before others in order to be seen by them..." Jesus warns the people to not be like the hypocrites who are giving alms so that they may be praised by others, praying so that they may be seen by others, or fasting and making faces about it to show others they are fasting.

Jesus cautions against doing good deeds for the sake of notoriety and praise from others. We need to do good deeds, yes, but we need to do good deeds because they are good to do. We need to do good for the sake of the difference it makes in us and our world.


Where is your heart today? Where are all of our hearts today?

The reading from Joel also invites us to consider this question. God calls the people to return. The reading calls for fasting, weeping, and mourning—these things are good to do. It is good to take care of our faith, to pray, to repent, to give, to even do that together. We just need to remember why we do all of these things.

The Season of Lent calls us to take an honest look at ourselves, remembering what's really important and naming our tendencies towards temptation. We are humbled as we pause to reflect on our mortality and salvation and to repent of the ways we can wander from where we want our hearts to be.





We repent. We reflect. We remember. We are dust, and to dust we shall return.

Casting Call

The Congregation will again be reading the **Passion Story** according to the **Gospel of Mark** during Worship Services on **Palm Sunday**, **March 24th**. As in the past, it will not be costumed or acted out; and there will be **no** extra **rehearsal** for this endeavor.

There will be a brief *review* of individual roles with coordinator TBD for the Contemporary Service and coordinator Don J. for the Traditional Service on Sunday, **March 17th** following each service in the Narthex. Booklets will be distributed at this time. This rehearsal is not mandatory for participating, but advisable, if you've never participated in the **Passion Story** experience before, or if you have questions about the role and movements.

So please consider, as part of your Lenten discipline, joining the small ensemble who will read individual characters' words of the Gospel that Sunday morning. The sign-up sheet for the different character roles, Narrator, Jesus, Peter, Judas, High Priest, Servant Girl, Pilate, and Bystander/Witness/Centurion, will be posted on the main hallway bulletin board in early March. Please take the time to identify a particular role you'd like to read for your worship time. Remember having varied voices for the congregational reading will add depth and clarity to the proclaiming of the Gospel that Sunday morning.

Easter Flowers

Again this year, we'll be adorning the sanctuary with potted plants on Easter morning. If you would like to purchase a pot of flowering plants (pansies again this year), please sign up on the sheet on the bulletin board. You would loan them to us for our Easter celebrations, then take them home to brighten your home, plant in your yard, or give as a gift. They are from Lyon's Greenhouse in Foxboro and are always healthy and generously sized. Details are on the sign up sheet—make checks payable to LCOR with "Easter plants" on the memo line, or put cash in an envelope, and then place in the offering. Cost is \$12.50 per pot.

Building and Grounds

LCOR has had Lawn Mowing Crew members that have worked hard since the Church was built to care for our YARD WORK lawn. We have a service for fertilizing/protecting the lawn, but do heavily depend upon this crew so to avoid the high costs in contracting this out. We have also been very fortunate to have a group of dedicated people over long periods of time to care for the mowing of our lawn. If not for these crew members, the lawn appearance and



quality would soon start to be affected, and where we do not want to lose this. And unfortunately, for a variety of reasons we have had a shrinking number of crew members (including just recently) leading to an overloading of others.

Therefore, I am reaching out with this communication seeking anyone willing to assist us by joining the 2024 LCOR Mowing Crew headed up by Paul Burns.

We are not asking for 16 weeks coverage, but rather 2-4 weeks during the season, and where these weeks would be based upon a sign-up schedule.

- We are not looking for significant blocks of weeks in a row unless this represented a "fit" as to your availability.
- Generally, we are mowing the lawn every Thursday/Friday (May September), but this could also be every other week depending upon the season and the rain.
- Paul B. would be the overall coordinator that would be working with the team so to match the schedule to volunteer availabilities.

The LCOR grounds depend heavily upon dedicated people like our Mowing CREW, but the more the volunteers, the easier the load to carry.

- Please think about your ability to join this crew, and thanks for listening to my request for assistance.

Many may know or maybe not this is accomplished by volunteers. For many years now about four individuals whom never seek recognition perform this work. One of our team will be moving on from this activity. Dan G.. Dan has been mowing the church lawn for many years. As with the others never seeking recognition but just giving of

his time and effort not to mention the beautiful landscaping he creates. We will see him at church and other functions but will miss him dearly on the team.

St. Pauly Textile Shed

Textile Donation Shed: Service/Volunteer Opportunity The problem: An EPA study says that 85% of clothing in the U.S. is ultimately thrown away instead of donated to be re-used or recycled. Also, did you know that textiles of any kind (clothing, linens, etc) can no longer be discarded in a landfill.

A potential solution: LCOR has partnered with a group called St. Pauly Textile, Inc. This is an organization that partners with organizations (like LCOR!) to collect clothing and other textiles in a uniquely clean and community friendly way. They set up a beautifully constructed, wood frame, clothing/textile drop-off shed in a community. The organization hosting the shed receives funding for all of the clothing donated to the shed. (These are not the metal bins that you've seen overflowing in various places)

The congregation council discussed this and after checking their references with other organizations who have one of their sheds on their property has decided to proceed. Frankly, it's a win-win! St Pauly provides the shed, maintains it (even if it's hit by a snow plow!), distributes the donations (wearable textiles to appropriate places, non-wearable textiles to recycling facilities). LCOR receives money based on the textile donations received. LCOR's responsibility is pretty minimal... Allow placement of the shed on our property (we've already been in contact with our insurers about this and they're also positive), and have someone(s) from our congregation be willing to check the shed 2-3 times/week. Specifically, to move things from inside the shed away from the "chute" to be sure that things can freely flow into the she and that there will never be a backup to the outside. The council views this as a good opportunity for not only revenue but for an environmentally friendly activity and service for those locally and globally without adequate clothing. We've done our due diligence on the organization and they seem quite reliable.

What can you do? We are in need of 3 "shed monitors". A shed monitor would commit to checking on the shed every other week on their own schedule.... To move things away from the inside of the chute. If there is a back up outside outside, call St. Pauley Textiles and they'll come to empty the shed. Being a shed monitor involves very little time(10-15" or likely less) every other week) but is crucial to the success of this endeavor. What a shed monitor does **not** do:

- *Maintain the shed in terms of painting, etc
- *Empty the shed or sort/transport the donations *Advertise the project.

Who can help? All of us!! Any one of any age can be a shed monitor. This is an excellent opportunity for someone to volunteer to help out on their own schedule... You decide when you'll check on the shed (along with your fellow shed monitors). No meetings....

St. Pauly Textile Shed (continued)

No other responsibilities. A teen looking to help out and fulfill community service hours for church or school... An adult looking for an opportunity to contribute to community and church on their own time that doesn't interfere with work or family time.... And again, all of us..... to donate our clothing and textiles.

Appropriate donations are: *Clothing of any kind including shoes, belts, purses. Wearable certainly.... But it's ok and encouraged to donate clothing that you aren't sure is wearable or re-usable. For example, clothing that is "out of style", a T shirt with a small hole, or pants with a frayed hem are all examples of wearable/usable clothing. *Sheets, towels, curtains.... even stuffed animals are donate-able!

*We are NOT looking for donations of rags or fabric scraps.




