### From the Pastor's Desk

What We Can Do

So many times when I attend a conference or lecture, I find myself really motivated by the ideas that are introduced or discussed. However, the question that often follows for me is how to respond to this topic or act on this information.



What can we do?

When it comes to church, there are so many possible answers to that question. We are part of a faith community that gives us the opportunity to act on a local, national, and global level through organizations and events. In June, delegates from LCOR will be attending the Synod Assembly in Worcester, where we will hear about the engagement of the church in our New England Synod as well as the activity of the ELCA (Evangelical Lutheran Church in America) across the country and around the world. A Bishop for the New England Synod as well as delegates to the Churchwide Assembly will also be elected. The Bishop will not only serve this synod, but will also work with other ELCA Bishops to collaborate and coordinate ministry and policy throughout the church. Delegates to the Churchwide Assembly will gather next year to hear and deliberate on churchwide issues as well as work that is taking place globally.

We are connected to all of this through our own congregation. Here at LCOR, each event and committee works to facilitate worship, community, service, and outreach. These ministries are part of that bigger picture, and they connect us to the churchwide impact even when they take place locally.

The wider reach of things like Synod Assembly or collections for World Hunger and the new Clothing Donation Shed may be fairly clear, but like the proverbial pebble dropped into the water, almost every action makes more of a difference than we know. For example, volunteers for Ushering and Altar Guild make sure everything is set up for worship and those who attend are welcomed and can follow along with the service or ask questions so that they can fully engage in worshipping God. Combine that with the worship services of all 160 congregations in the New England Synod or roughly 8,600 across the country, and that volunteer is not only making a difference for the individual attending on a given Sunday, but they are contributing to something much larger as well.

Food pantry collections, volunteer days, educational programs, and community events also connect us in this way. A service project or collection can make a difference to an individual or group, and it contributes to the total impact of all service projects and collections for that cause.

### From the Pastor's Desk (continued)

An educational class or book discussion might engage us in listening and learning about a topic, but our changed understanding also affects the world around us through our new perspectives and resulting actions.

I encourage you to look through the rest of this newsletter for the many events, programs, and opportunities to get involved and be part of the church community here at LCOR. If you can, find some-



thing new or different to try and consider how that connects you to the wider church. We have opportunities every week, if not every day, to learn and grow as Christians. Through our lives and actions, we also have the chance to support and be supported by our faith community.



### Altar Flowers
