From the Pastor's Desk

Very Human Disciples

The next time you're reading a passage from one of the Gospels, I encourage you to watch out for the disciples. It's amazing. They are so human. Their personalities and actions sometimes are as varied and unique as our own.

Peter is given the Power of the Keys, yet denies Jesus after the arrest.¹ Thomas declares he would follow Jesus into



Jerusalem, but won't believe the resurrection until he sees it for himself.² Philip is practical, calculating the magnitude of feeding five thousand people.³ Nathanael is contemplative, but has some biases to address.⁴ They all get into arguments about which one of them is the best.⁵ As far as jobs go, Matthew is a tax collector,⁶ and Andrew, Peter, James, and John are fishermen.⁷

As a whole, the disciples often worry, get the wrong answer, panic, or fail to see the possibilities of a situation. They are faithful and flawed—and they keep going. They make mistakes, but they stay true. They stay together. They stay with Jesus—and Jesus stays with them, too. Jesus teaches and keeps teaching. The disciples follow and keep following.

There are times we might feel like our occupation, personality, style, energy, or even our human nature doesn't fit with being a disciple. But then, Matthew and Peter and Thomas and the rest were called to follow Jesus. There wasn't just one type of disciple, and the different personalities and gifts of each of them reflected and supported the variety of people in the world they would eventually serve and teach themselves. That's true now, too.

Like the disciples, we are also called to faithfully follow Jesus and to be intentional about how we encounter, interact with, and minister to the world around us. The unique gifts, skills, and personalities each of us have been given help us as we interact with the individuals who are our neighbors. Even our mistakes teach us about forgiveness and endurance—a lesson from which we deepen our understanding of grace and our ability to extend forgiveness and understanding to others in turn.

As we start this new fall season, may we be mindful of the ways we can learn from the disciples' example. We are called to be faithful witnesses—to keep going, knowing that we are supported by God and one another as we follow Jesus in our own very human lives.







Altar Flowers

If you'd like to put flowers on the altar, simply sign up on the large flower chart on the bulletin board in the hallway leading to the education wing.

They may be given in honor of someone, in memory of someone, an event (anniversary birthday etc.), or simply to the glory of God! If the flowers are being given in honor or memory of someone, please write that on the flower chart. If no reason is stated on the chart then flowers will be given to the "Glory of God."

You must sign up a minimum of 7 days in advance. Flower arrangements are **\$35 each**. Please place your payment in the offering plate and be sure you designate the payment as "altar flowers."

These flowers belong to you, after the flowers adorn the altar area for both services, please take your flowers home.
